

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Students from India to US




In 2011/12, 100,270 students from India were studying in the US (down 3.5% from the previous year).

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
Top Sending Countries to the US



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Top Destinations for Indian Students, 2012



Academic Level, 2012




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U.S. Education Abroad to India



In 2010/11, enrollment in India jumped 11.9% on top of a 44.4% increase in 2009/10.



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## Indian Higher Education: Background

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- The Indian Constitution guarantees higher education in India.
- Universities and Institutions of National Importance are established through an Act of Indian Parliament (national) or by legislative Acts of the State or Province.
- Private Universities are established though legislative Acts at the Central/State levels and are registered societies, a public trust or a company.
- Established 1953 University Grants Commission (UGC);
   1956 Act of Parliament Statutory body of the
   Government of India and
- Relationship between the Universities and UGC

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### Indian Higher Education: Typology

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#### The types of Universities are:

- Central Universities, State
   Universities, and Institution of
   National Importance
- Deemed to be Universities
- Affiliate Universities
- Open Universities
- Private Universities
- Other Private Universities

- 611 universities/ university level institutions and 33,023 colleges
- Enrollment: 14.6 m, technical Ed 1.9 million.
- Faculty .7 million
- India's population in 2012 was 1.21 billion (3/12) and 60% were under 25 yrs.



### Indian Higher Education: Technical Education

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- Funded largely by 1) central government, 2) state government, and 3) private industry and may be under Institutions of National Importance
- Curricula reflects training in science, engineering, technology and math; architecture, business management, hotel management, pharmacy, information technology, town planning and vocational education (arts and craft, and catering)
- Awards post graduate diplomas, master and doctorate degrees; a few grant undergraduate degrees
- Institutes such as the IITs, IIMs, IISERs, IISc, IIIT, and so forth
- Majority are world renown in teaching, research, and interactions with industries and employment. They are registered societies governed by their respective Board of Governors.

## Indian Higher Education: Reform

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The National Knowledge Commission Report on Higher Education (2009-10) prompted the government to initiate various reforms. There are five bills in the parliament to address reforms. These are:

- National Commission/Council for Higher Education and Research Bill
- National Accreditation Regulatory Authority for Higher Education Institutions Bill
- Prohibition of unfair practices in Technical Education
   Institutions, Medical Education Institutions and University Bill
- The Educational Tribunals Bill
- The Foreign Education Institutions Bill

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### **Policy Challenges**

- High demand: 370M Indian school-age citizens
- Capacity building and educational infrastructure
- Educational equity and access
- Systems of complex regulations
- Implementing comprehensive accreditation
