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




About HED


- **HED Mission**: supporting partnerships between U.S. and host-country higher education institutions to address local and national development challenges.
- Founded by six higher education presidential associations¹ in 1992. Formerly known as "Association Liaison Office for University Cooperation in Development" (ALO).
- Funded as a nonprofit by USAID/EGAT, USAID Bilateral Missions, and the U.S. State Department.

*HED was founded by the American Council on Education, American Association of Community Colleges, American Association of State Colleges and Universities, Association of American Universities, National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities, and the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities, formerly the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges.



HED is supported through a cooperative agreement between the U.S. Agency for International Development and the American Council on Education.

HED operates with the advice and counsel of six higher education presidential associations: American Council on Education American Association of Community Colleges American Association of State Colleges and Universities Association of American Universities Association of Public and Land-grant Universities National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities









HED Partnerships

- Build human and institutional capacity to increase capacity of host-country higher education institutions to contribute to local and national development.
- Represent the breadth and depth of U.S. higher education:
 - HED has supported more than 350 international partnerships.
 - In FY2011, HED supported **75** partnerships involving 81 host-country tertiary institutions in 35 countries and 58 U.S. higher education institutions.







Leadership Initiative for Public Health in East Africa (LIPHEA)

- Funding Agency: USAID's Bureau for Global Health
- African Partner Institutions: Muhimbili University College of Health Sciences and the Makerere University School of Public Health
- **U.S. Partner Institutions:** Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health and Tulane University
- Award: \$2 million followed by \$3.9 million
- **Period of Implementation:** January 2006 through March 2011







Objectives of LIPHEA

- Strengthen public health leadership in East Africa by improving the capacity of local institutions to train mid- and senior-level health professionals in leadership skills.
- Create a cadre of professionally trained health leaders better able to envision, plan, implement, and manage effective responses to the health needs of Africans with an emphasis on zoonotic diseases.
