#### Newcastle, Australia

- The city of Newcastle is approximately 190km north of Sydney
- The University of Newcastle serves Newcastle and surrounding areas; approximately 400,000 people
- Newcastle City has approximately 142,000 residents; only 11.35% from a culturally and linguistically diverse background (this figure includes international students)
- Newcastle residents have limited exposure to cultural difference (approximately half that of other large centres across Australia)


#### **The University of Newcastle**

- The University of Newcastle's main campus is located in the Newcastle local government area
- This campus is culturally diverse with students from 100 countries represented
- Prior to 2007 most Muslim students at Newcastle came from Indonesia and Malaysia
- In 2007 there were increased enrolments of students from Saudi Arabia

#### **Community Connections**

- Volunteer program international students build friendships and develop networks with members of the local community
- Volunteers receive training
- Operating for 13 years students and families matched by coordinator
- Volunteers and students have weekly contact
- Recruited more than 1, 000 volunteers from the local community including staff and students of the University





#### **Cultural Connections**

- Weekly program for the partners of international students
- Participants meet weekly over lunch to talk, share, interact and hear from guest speakers
- Creates a forum for participants to share aspects of their home culture with others
- Helps overcome issues of isolation and loneliness
- Builds stronger connections to the University and wider community
- Provides information and practical support
- Creates and enhances friendships



#### **Muslim Women's Group**

- This program meets the needs of women who choose not to attend the Cultural Connections program because men are present
- Program provides English conversation and playgroup for young children
- Meets weekly for two hours. Participants are from Iran, Pakistan, Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Oman, Bangladesh, Malaysia and Indonesia
- Program Coordinator is a member of the local Muslim community; four non-Muslim volunteers from the local community attend the program to practise English with the participants in a relaxed, friendly atmosphere





#### The University of Newcastle Experience



- Education relates to more than the classroom
- Universities are part of the broader community
- Distinctive cultural aspects need to be recognised and celebrated in informed, not naïve, ways
- Need to work at and evaluate initiatives
