Global Gateways - Strategy

- Base of operations for faculty research/teaching and international partnerships
- Portal for study abroad
- Alumni gatherings, tracking and programming e.g. connect alumni to Columbus campus
- Academic programming and executive education/training
- International student recruitment and distribution of information about OSU
- Partnership with Ohio-based companies ODOD connection

Locations

 Countries where OSU already has significant connections through Study Abroad Programs, Faculty Teaching and Research, University Partnerships, Alumni, International Students, Ohio Businesses

Implementation

 Gateways offices consist of leased space in two phases starting with China, India and Brazil and continuing with gateway offices in Turkey, the UK, Eastern Europe and East Africa.
